

Message from Emily Mainwaring, Deputy Head



Dear Parents and Carer,

It has been so lovely for the teachers to catch up with your child each morning on Microsoft Teams. It is a great way for them to continue to feel like an important part of our school community and to keep in touch during the sessions with their friends and class teams. Please see below some guidance about how best to use this new technology safely and positively.

PARENT PROTOCOL FOR



HOW TO USE AND KEEP SAFE WHEN USING MICROSOFT TEAMS

Primary Classes

1. Only answer calls from my teacher.



2. Be out of bed and dressed.



3. Be in a room with an adult.



4. Remember that everybody can see and hear what is happening in the background.



5. Remember Microsoft Teams is a time to talk about what you have been doing and how you have got on with the daily challenge.





PARENT PROTOCOL FOR Microsoft teams

SECONDARY CLASSES

- Please ensure your child joins their session in a shared space where you can monitor them. Ideally a living or dining room with a blank wall background.
- Your child must not be joining Microsoft Team from their bedroom.
- No pyjamas. Pupils need to be dressed appropriately and ready for the day.
- Encourage your child, if possible, to blur or set their background to an appropriate still picture.
 - Parents, please be mindful that other pupils might see or hear anything in the background.
 - Pupils must not instigate 1:1 video calls with any teachers.
 - Parents and children should not be using the student's login to gain access to the contact details of teachers or other students.
 - Parents and pupils must not use Microsoft Teams for anything other than morning registrations and agreed communication with the teacher. It is not to be used for any non-school related activity.





Speech and Language Therapy Update

The team have been hard at work planning and organising the best ways we can support the children's speech and language whilst they are at home. Over the next couple of weeks, we will be contacting each of the families on our caseload. This will be a phone call where we can: discuss your child's current needs and progress, talk through anything you are finding challenging, jointly come up with 1-2 targets which you can focus on, provide any additional recommendations/strategies. During this call we will also discuss how we plan to continue to support you and your child at home. The frequency of contact you receive from the team will depend on your child's needs and your home situation, and we will keep your child's teachers updated on any suggestions we make.






