He showed us how the people at the hospital might listen to our breathing, how to make a sling, and even put Ciaran's arm in a plaster cast!

Unfortunately, Gosden House also seems to have a very naughty bus who, overnight, has been making a mess in the Badger classroom! The children have been very motivated to write letters to Naughty Bus and remind him of our classroom rules. This week (after another incident), they have thought about words to describe the Naughty Bus to create wonderful, descriptive WANTED posters to share around school.








We enjoyed a visit to Brooklands

The children were set a variety of tricky challenges to try to complete and improve on. The children have been working together with their friends and developing their Maths skills when making their own dice games; including a giant snakes and ladders game for the whole class to play together. They were very creative with their ideas and were able to show their problem solving skills as they worked out how to create, set up and play their games.









