This half term we have started to learn about 'People Who Help Us' as our topic. This week we learned all about dentists, finding out what their job is and why it is important to look after our teeth. We used teeth in our Maths to sort quantities into 'groups of one' or 'lots/more than one'. We have also started to learn about money and how to recognise different coins and use 1p coins to support our counting out and counting on.







One thing that the whole class has been really enthusiastic about has been their different art projects. Each week they have been designing and creating a different art project to say thank you to different people in society and our local school community who help us.

Fox Class have started the new term as they mean to go on, kicking off the first week of 2023 full of curiosity, enthusiasm and motivation.

We have begun work on our new topic of Transport. We were all fascinated with the invention of the hot air balloon and spontaneously decided to delve into researching the science behind the magical balloons. We would like to create some mini hot air balloons of our own and perhaps our own inventions.



In our Literacy lesson last week, we had a special delivery, a mystery parcel addressed to Fox Class. Inside the package was our new class book 'The Jolly Postman' and a letter from the postman. This week we wrote letters to Goldilocks from Baby Bear replying to her birthday party invitation. We are looking forward to joining the Jolly Postman on many more adventures during our literacy lessons.

During the first weeks in Numeracy, we have been solving Maths problems such as' finding the difference' using Numicon to show our working out. We've also started learning about the measurement of time.



Over the coming weeks we will be spending time outdoors, working on our number knowledge and developing our communication skills alongside plenty of opportunities for teamwork activities. As part of our topic work, we will be visiting the Brooklands Museum later in the term, which promises to be a fun filled, hands on day out! This half term we will also researching recipes and making a meal that we can all enjoy in our home economics kitchen.

Our Science topic this term is Forces. We started thinking about 'movement', particularly exploring the different ways our bodies move. We had fun on the playground investigating this and recorded what we saw using a tally chart. This week we thought about the difference between pushing and pulling. We used the learning habit 'noticing' as we sorted toys in a Venn diagram according to how they move.









YEAR 10

Year 10 are getting back into the swing of things again after the Christmas Holidays and have made a great start to the term.



This week in Science we continued our work on gravity by taking part in the Egg Drop Challenge. We got very competitive as we split into teams, using our learning muscles of 'Learning Together' and 'Keep Improving' to try out different methods of protecting our eggs. One team even made a parachute for their egg! It was very close but the girls team won in the end, after we discovered a teeny tiny crack in the boys egg.







On Wednesday we had an exciting visitor called Helen from the RNLI. She gave a talk to all of Key Stage 4 about the work of the Lifeboat Institute, and how to stay safe around water including our local waterways. Everyone did a brilliant job of listening carefully and asking some great questions.

We have been thinking lots this week about the future and completed a Future Pathways activity on Thursday. It was a really good opportunity to have a chat with the adults about what we are good at and what we might like to do in the future. It helped us think about our 'Work Ready' toolbox and the skills we might need to work on.



Finally, the exciting news to start off the term is that the Gosden Bakehouse is open! This is our coffee shop being run by Key Stage 4 students on a Thursday morning for the adults. More to come, but we have made a brilliant start and have received great feedback on our hot drinks and treats!




