Firefighters

Rabbits used their 'Learning Together' and 'Creative' Learning Habits to work together to put the 'fire' out in class! We created fire engines using junk resources and made fire explosions in Science. We were extremely lucky to have a special visit from Simon the Firefighter who answered all of our questions and let us try on his uniform!



Police

Rabbits enjoyed role-playing as police, "arresting" their friends and teachers, and calling "999" on the walkie-talkie. They created policecar art, and became police detectives in a finger-print Science experiment!









Dentists

Rabbits used their 'Keep Trying' skills to practice their careful counting in dentist-themed Numeracy. In Literacy, they worked hard to follow a sequence to brush the teeth until they were sparkling clean!





Doctors and Nurses

Rabbits were so fortunate to also have a visit from Sam the Nurse. Rabbits enjoyed 'Exploring' Sam's equipment, and trying on the sling and bandages. Rabbits were inspired to imitate this back in the classroom by helping to bandage teddy's head when he had a little bump. Great 'Noticing'!







Builders

This week we have been learning all about builders. Rabbits have enjoyed building using magnetic shapes and role-playing to 'fix' the 'broken' furniture in class!




Squirrels class have had a fantastic first half of term and have got really stuck in with their learning!

In Literacy we have been learning about poetry. We started with 'Rumble in the Jungle' and since then have looked at lots of different animal poems. The children used their 'Creative' Learning Habit to write their own version of a poem about their favourite African animal. They also had a go at performing them!

We have had lots going on in Maths. We have been working on matching Numicon, number bonds, subtraction and some statistics! Last week we used our 'Creative' and 'Keep Trying' Learning Habits to create our own number stories about subtraction.



SQUIRRELS







In Science we have been learning about sound. We have had fun doing lots of different experiments to explore how sound is made. Through this we learned that sound is made by vibrations and travels as sound waves. This week we tested cup-string telephones and realised that the sound travelled along the string. We worked in groups and as a challenge tried to make giant cup-string telephones the length of the entire lunch hall!

Our new topic is Africa. We have learnt that Africa is a continent made up of lots of countries. We have used our 'Noticing' Learning Habit to look at different African landscapes and discussed how these are different to the landscapes we have here in the UK. We created some of these landscapes while painting some stunning African sunsets! We have also loved learning about all the different animals that exist in Africa - we wrote poetry about them in Literacy and went on our own safari in the playground!





In PE Squirrels have started gymnastics. We have been exploring the different shapes and balances we can make on mats and have challenged ourselves by balancing, travelling and jumping off new equipment.

YEAR 9



There has been lots of amazing learning happening in Year 9!

This week saw the grand reopening of the KS3 tuck shop. We all loved visiting the shop for some delicious treats. We had to use our communication skills to ask for what we wanted, Maths money skills to work out how much to pay and which coins to use and, our turntaking skills as there was a long queue!




Our Topic has been all about 'microbes'. We decided to investigate which condition helped mould to grow. We left bread in different places around the classroom for 2 weeks and then this week we looked at what had happened! We found out that heat and light help mould to grow. Our bread in the cold, dark place (the fridge) had no mould on it at all. Whilst the bread in the warm, sunny place (our shelves) was completely green and mouldy! Yuck! We are now planning to make our own bread bins to try and stop our bread from going mouldy.











Work Experience this year has been **AMAZING** and, although I say this every year, it REALLY has! All students have used **all** of their Learning Muscles **every single day**.


