The children have really enjoyed growing and tasting their own cress, playing Maths games, finding their favourite stories in the Library and helping to care for the animals


at Gosden.


We have been using our 'Learning Together' Learning Habit and have strong bonds of friendship. The children can often be seen helping each other on the playground, giving their friend's their water bottle or making one another laugh. Because we are such experts we decided to make our own 'Recipe for a Good Friend'! The children chose which ingredients needed to go in the bin and which needed to go into our recipe. We then mixed them together and created a magic spell. Wait and see what magic we conjure up next in Owl class....



It has been a busy start to the school year in Foxes. We have been playing lots of games helping us get to know each other and our new classroom. We used our Learning Habit 'Noticing' as we researched the fox animal. We explored Gosden's grounds looking for signs of fox life and were very excited when we found some fox holes. We also had fun creating different types of fox crafts to decorate our classroom.











In Maths, we have been focusing on number ordering. We enjoyed being outside and making number lines with natural materials. A very cheeky puppet called Geoffrey visited our class. He kept mixing up our numbers and stealing some of them. Fox class used their 'Learning Together' habit and were amazing at sorting the numbers out and finding the missing numbers.



Our topic is 'Fire and Volcanoes'. We have been learning about fire safety and used our Learning Habit 'Explore,' to try and find different fire related equipment around the school building. We used what we had learnt to make fire safety posters. We have also been busy writing volcano poems, baking volcano cupcakes and making a model showing the layers of the earth.

We are looking forward to finding out why volcanoes happen and where they can be found, as well as using our 'Creative' Learning Habit to make volcano-inspired pieces of art.







The new Year 10's have made a brilliant start to their transition to Key Stage 4.

In our first week back we chose our class jobs, thinking carefully about the things we are already good at and what we want to get better at. Our class jobs are a great opportunity for us to work on our Life Skills and Employability skills for our toolkit.

One of our favourite things about Key Stage 4 is our vocational options on Thursday and Friday mornings. We have been taking care of the animals, picking vegetables from the Gosden garden, getting creative in Arts award. working on our IT skills and cooking up a storm in the kitchen. The Out and About group had a great trip in Bramley, practising our road safety and seeing what places there are to visit. They represented the school really well! We will be sharing what we have done with the whole school soon in our first class assembly of the year.









We are also really enjoying Keeping Healthy in our PE sessions with Lee from Planet Soccer, this week we did some orienteering which meant we had to do lots of Learning Together.

In the afternoons we are starting our ASDAN coursework focusing on topics like Safety in the Home and Community and Working Towards Goals. This week we helped each other think about the skills we have and the things we are good at which was great for our Emotional Wellbeing. It was great to see the kind words we all used about each other.

Hello,

I hope you all had a wonderful time in the summer and are enjoying settling back in to school life!

Technology is such a great thing and we want our students to enjoy learning and playing games online safely. One way that you can help to ensure this is setting up parental controls on any devices your children have access to.

Parental controls allow you to block ad filter upsetting or inappropriate content. They work across your WiFi, phone network or on individual apps and devices.

They can also help you to plan what time of the day your child can go online and how long for.


