Robin Class are quickly approaching the end of their first half-term at Gosden, and are finishing off their first full week at school too! We are incredibly proud of each and every one of them for the brilliant start they have made to their school year, mastering our class routines and creating budding new friendships with their peers.



Our topic for this half-term is 'Healthy Me', and we have used this as a basis for all of our learning. We have used our 'Exploring' Learning Muscle and explored some of the noises our bodies can make. We have used mirrors to watch different facial expressions, made marks to represent labels for some body parts, and challenged ourselves to climb, pedal and jump!



In our Maths learning, we have been joining in with rote counting (and we're great at using our big number line to help with this!), moving objects and saying one number at a time, and counting out amounts. We really enjoyed play dough splat, where we "hulk-smashed" all of the dough, counting as we went.



This week, we have started to explore our new story -Kitchen Disco! After reading through our story to get more familiar with it, we have begun to use Colourful Semantics to identify the 'Who?' and the 'What doing?' on each page. We are very excited to see what the Robins get up to next!





Badgers have had a very exciting start to the year. We have been working really hard in Maths, counting, matching, comparing and ordering numbers as well as recognising numerals. We have had to use our 'Problem Solving' and 'Keep Trying'

Learning Habits.












Each week, in Literacy we have concentrated on a book and our favourites have been Jack and the Jellybean Stalk and Mr Big. We have talked about the characters in the stories, and identified what they were doing and how they were feeling. We have created sentences using widgets, completed sentences to tell the story and also practised writing them. When we read The Smartest Giant in Town, we even crawled into a sleeping bag to see if we could describe what it was like!



The arrival of autumn has brought an abundance of outdoor learning opportunities for us. We have enjoyed, 'Learning Together', with our friends from other classes including, Squirrel Class, Rabbit Class and Fox Class. We have enjoyed 'Exploring' our woodland together and using our Learning Habit 'Noticing' to observe how our environment has changed over the past weeks. We all enjoyed learning and singing new songs around the fire circle and worked together with the younger children from Badger Class to make nature confetti wands.









Last week we enjoyed playing woodland games.

Woodpecker and Squirrel Class needed to use the Learning Habits of 'Listening, Problem Solving, Keep Trying and Learning Together' to complete a number of team games.

Our outdoor Maths lesson with Fox Class taught us that nature really is the best classroom and provides us with an abundance of natural resources to use in our maths lessons. We used this session to look at sorting grouping, problem solving and counting. We used more of our Learning Habits including 'Listening' to solve a number of Maths problems set by the

teachers.

abundance.






Year 7s have had a busy and fun start to the new academic year. The first year in Secondary and first year for most of us at Gosden House!

In "Our World" lessons, we have asking what people need to build a settlement. We also learnt about how people survive living in the Arctic Circle. We are all looking forward to our upcoming trip to Butser Farm, where we will learn about Celtic Settlement and life.




## **WELL DONE!**


