We are so proud of how well the Rabbits have settled into their new classroom environment. This half-term has been filled with so much fun!

Topic: 'Healthy Me'

Rabbits have been busy using their 'Exploring' and 'Learning Together' Habits to learn all about how to be healthy through exercise, eating healthily, sleep, playing with our friends, self-care routines and more! They have enjoyed learning about the importance of balance, resting after exercise, and eating a balanced diet. Children have participated in various role-play opportunities and enjoyed moving their bodies outside! Rabbits have particularly enjoyed collecting and growing their own fruits and practicing their careful counting to make 'healthy stew' in Numeracy.













Focus Week: Problem Solving

Rabbit Class have demonstrated excellent use of their '**Problem Solving**' Habit this week for our Focus Week! They have role-played as builders at the tuff-tray and engaged in small-world play to problem solve! Rabbit Class also thoroughly enjoyed using their '**Creative**' and '**Learning Together**' Habits to build 'Tim the Teddy' a den to sleep in!

Happy & Healthy

Rabbits have engaged beautifully in the Happy and Healthy Curriculum this half-term! They have enjoyed Apple Morning, Bucket Therapy sessions, and 1:1 Reading with Penny and Ash, the therapy dog





At the start of the term, Squirrels became archaeologists and had to go on a dig to find out what our topic was. We discovered lots of strange objects and using our Learning Muscles - of **Problem Solving**, Learning Together and Asking Questions we realised it was Ancient Egypt. We learned about mummification and all the different steps involved and we then put these into practice mummifying our own tomatoes and sealing them in containers. We are looking forward to opening them up after half term and seeing if it worked.



In Literacy we have been reading "The Dragon Machine". We had fun going on a dragon hunt; we had to notice where the dragons were and use positional language to describe where they were hidden. In the book George builds his own dragon machine. We used our **Creative Learning** habit to draw designs for our own dragon machines, described them using lots of adjectives and then explaining how they work.

This week as part of our Problem-Solving Focus Week we found a cryptic message from an Egyptian Pharaoh asking how to build a pyramid. Using our **Problem Solving** and **Learning Together** Learning Habits, we discovered the message was written in hieroglyphics and managed to decode it. We then researched pyramids and explored different ways of building them.



In Maths we have been exploring different ways to represent numbers, using Numicon, tens frames, bead strings, and straws. We have also been working on counting in tens. In our shape topic, we have been exploring properties of 3D shapes and had a go building some of our own shapes using marshmallows and cocktail sticks.

Solving

Squirrels and Woodpeckers have enjoyed Learning Together this week as they considered how they could stop Humpty Dumpty from cracking when he fell off the wall. After **Exploring** a variety of materials and investigating different designs we created our own egg protections models and then dropped them to see if we could prevent our eggs from cracking.













Squirrels and Woodpeckers Worked Together to uncover a secret message left in the classroom. We investigated what the images on the message might mean. After researching using books and the internet they discovered they were written in Hieroglyphics. The challenge was set to decode the message and solve the problem posed – How do you build a pyramid? During Problem Solving Week Year 9 have loved using all their Learning Muscles to get stuck in! First we used our 'Learning Together' muscles to look at the results of our mouldy bread Science investigation. We left bread in different places around the classroom to see which would go the mouldiest. We worked out that the bread in the warmest places went the mouldiest and the bread in the coldest places stayed the freshest! If you want your bread to last longer Year 9 suggest putting it in the freezer.











We also investigated our 'drop it' challenge. We looked at a couple of different ways that aid is dropped from aeroplanes to areas that need it. We were then challenged to design our own system to safely drop an egg from height to make sure that it landed in one piece. Just like the aid drops from the aeroplane. We used our 'Keep improving' muscle to adjust our designs as we began to build and our 'being brave' muscles to have a go! We worked so hard on our delivery systems and had great fun testing them.

This term we voted for our new School Council. The students gave a speech to their class and then the class went to the voting station to choose who should be the Councillors. Year 8 interviewed the new councillors and asked them lots of auestions.

What charities would you Research cancer, homeless shelters, animal support? shelters, Children in Need, Red Nose Day and raising money for our school.'







In DT, learners have been working towards building their very own clock. They have designed and built their product from scratch and were proud to show off their final results this week.
