The SEND team will help you with referrals for diagnoses etc. Owls had a fabulous time during Problem Solving Week before half term. They helped cars cross the classroom without getting stuck in mud, animals cross crocodile infested waters, moved water so they could water the plants with no watering cans available, and even rescued our toys from the ice Elsa had accidentally trapped them in!







After half term the Owls came back raring to get in to their learning! We have been making potions, counting out spooky ingredients, writing recipes and turning each other into different animals. We planned a Halloween party, writing invitations and making cakes.



A real highlight was our visit from Harry and Henry the hedgehogs last week. The children learned all about hedgehogs and afterwards made their own model hedgehogs – what a great inspiration!





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This week we are starting our new topic – learning all about different kinds of toys old and new. Fox Class started the new half-term with some Halloween celebrations. We had lots of fun choosing a pumpkin from the Gosden Patch and then transforming it into some delicious muffins!



In Maths, we've been using our Learning Habits 'Problem Solving' and 'Noticing' whilst learning about 2 dimensional and 3 dimensional shapes. We followed shape monster recipes, looked at works of art inspired by shapes and then created our own masterpieces. We also made our own 3d shapes using different materials, including marshmallows!









Hedgehog visit

In Literacy, we have been reading the story 'Vladimir the Volcano'. This inspired us to use our 'Creative' habit to make fire music, perform volcano dances and create our own actions for telling the story.







Year 7 Forest School Team visited Blackheath Common last week. Whilst there we engaged in a range of activities, mainly exploring the woodland and the surrounding area. We spotted a range of funghi which captured everyone's interest. We explored as a team and helped each other along the way. The team enjoyed racing in the sand and finding lots of interesting natural objects.

We used landmarks and maps and to find our way back to the carpark.

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


In PE we have been learning about gymnastics and have tried to create key shapes such as the straddle, pike and tuck. We have enjoyed doing our lessons in the drama studio so we can see the shapes of our bodies in the large mirror.



This week in citizenship we have been preparing for Children in Need (which is on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November) by thinking about why it is important to support charities and how we can help other people. We are looking forward to sharing our posters with the whole school so they know how we are supporting this good cause. We have used our learning muscles of **Learning Together, Being Brave** and Emotional Wellbeing.

Over the last couple of weeks, Year 7 have been potty about performance poetry in our Literacy lessons! We have read 'Chocolate Cake' by Michael Rosen and 'Me Stew, by Shel Silverstein. We have been exploring language through rhythm, rhyme and repetition through drama and performing to our peers. We are looking forward to finding out about other poets and creating poems of our own to perform and share.











This week we have had another successful School Council meeting where we had a jam-packed agenda to cover.

We began by creating our own job description of what we think a School Councillor should be. Highlights of this conversation included: listening to others, taking ownership and representing our classes and seeing ourselves as ambassadors of our school. We were able to share our ideas and demonstrated respect by listening when others spoke.

We also discussed our two charity events for next week, which are Odd Socks Day on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November and Children in Need on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November. As we talked, we made suggestions about why these events were important and how we could create posters during our citizenship lessons to make the rest of the school aware of the details for the days.

Our meeting ended with a suggestion that was discussed in great detail that we shall be emailing Cindy about, and another vote - which was unanimous. We are aware of how important it is to make a democratic vote. We also talked through why we wanted to make a change and tried to problem solve any issues which may arise. The whole team realised that our suggestion may not be approved but we wanted to try and make a formal suggestion by writing an email. We know this is an important part of the decision making process.



Later this week, we will meeting our local MP Angela Richardson. We shall be asking her questions which are important to us and also we shall be showing her how amazing our school is. We will let you know how the meeting goes in the next Newsletter! A group of Year 10 and 11 students, who have taken Food Studies in Key Stage 4, had a very exciting trip this week to Pizza Express in Godalming, where we learnt how to make tasty margherita pizzas.

We stretched the dough, added toppings and cooked them in the big pizza ovens. Afterwards we did a quiz on all of the different ingredients, using what we had learnt in our practical lessons to come up with some brilliant answers. We used our **Learning Together** Learning Muscles to work in a new environment and speak politely and confidently to the staff at Pizza Express.

In Food Studies we have been baking with fresh Gosden grown produce. Last week we made a pumpkin pie with a pumpkin grown in the school pumpkin patch by Plant Care students. We were really interested to learn how we could use a vegetable to make something sweet – and used our **Being Brave** Learning Muscles to do a taste test. We thought it was delicious!









In DT we have had a brilliant first term working hard on our clocks, which we have designed and made from scratch. We have now chosen our own personal projects, many of which are things to improve our school including some new signs for the garden area and a 3D mural showing all the best parts of Gosden.





On Monday afternoons in PSHE we have been working on our Emotional Wellbeing by setting ourselves goals for the year, and regularly working at these. Some examples of our goals are 'Improve my handwriting', 'Learn how to play tennis', 'Learn how to play tennis', 'Learn how to pay for something in a shop by myself' and 'Teach my class about the Severn Valley railway'. In KS4, we are very excited that our **Social Enterprise Project** is up and running again, and we are so pleased to be back at The Forge on the Green, in Shamley Green, working with the wonderful owners, Robyn and Osha.

On Thursday afternoons, a small group of learners visit the café and work with the trained staff to learn about the catering and hospitality industry. They become experts on using the tills, making coffee, baking in the kitchen and customer service.

During the project, learners raise money through the sales of their cookies and have the opportunity to decide how that money is spent to benefit the Gosden House.



Last week, four learners went to visit The Forge, to introduce themselves. This week they begin their exciting five week journey. Their first job is to decide on their team name, as well as make a big decision as to how they would like to spend their profits.

Hello,

Lots of us use social media to keep in touch with family and friends. Increasingly, children and young people are using social media for the same reasons as well. A few things to remember if your child does use social media -

Age ratings and features - Get to know the age ratings of the apps. Many have a minimum age of 13 years old so can not be used before this age. However, you know your child best, and you might decide that they need to be a little bit older before it's suitable for them.

**Review the location settings -** Review the location settings on apps to ensure that their location is not being shared.

Get to know the safety and privacy settings - Explore the safety and privacy settings on any app, to decide which are right to use for your child. Each app has slightly different ways to set up an account, but most have the option to set an account to private, to not allow friend requests, and to hide the user's location. All of which can be helpful.


