This half-term, the Robins have been **Exploring** our topic of Toys. We had a very special visitor. Her name was Pat, and she works in a toy museum - though she did look very much like CJ from the office with a very curly wig!

Pat came to see us because she desperately needed our help. She had just started her new job, and needed the Robins to help her to label all of the toys. Everyone sprang into action, and did their most beautiful mark making to help Pat, making labels for cars, Lego, blocks and iPads! Pat was so grateful, but needed some more help! She asked us to help her to sort some toys into old and new. The Robins were happy to help, especially as they got to play with lots of different toys as they sorted them into their categories! The Robins have also decorated their own toys using different art resources, and did a brilliant job of moving toy soldiers, spinning tops and dinosaurs in our PE session.







In our Maths learning, we have **explored** a range of 2D shapes, matching them regardless of colour or size, and beginning to identify the properties that we could see. We have also been counting

amounts up to 10 out of groups, and this week, we have been working on recognising amounts withou counting them (super challenging!). We have also started our Phase 2 Phonics session, and have been working hard to form sounds and orally blend CVC words.





It has been a brilliant half-term for the Robins, and we are so proud of all of their learning achievements The second half term for Badger Class has been just as busy as the first!


We have been finding out about the Great Fire of London. We have used the 'Listening' Learning Habit to listen to historical fiction and non-fiction books to find out how it started, how people escaped the flames and how the fire was put out. We have created sentences using Widget, and have practised saying them. We are working really hard on our pencil control. We can also sing and sign a fantastic song about the Great Fire!

Badgers use their 'Keep Trying'
Learning Habit every morning as we work really hard on our phonics. We know the sounds and cued articulation signs for more than half of the Phase 2 sounds and we are making words with magnetic letters and beginning to blend.





We love using our 'Creative' Learning Habit in PE as we are doing gymnastics this half term. We have made shapes and practised balancing on different parts of our bodies.



### Come and watch us dance in the Christmas Production!





In Maths, we have been finding out that numbers are made up of smaller numbers and have even been working on the part, part, whole model. This week we have started work on position and direction and we have been dancing to a left and right rap!

Woodpeckers have been using all their Learning Habits recently. This half term they have been 'Challenging' themselves by taking part in Yvonne Arnaud's Discover Theatre Workshops as part of achieving their Arts Award. Each week we 'Explore' a different aspect of pantomime, looking at characters, costumes, scenes and script.

This week we used our 'Learning Together' skills to create 'Slosh Scenes' - comedy scenes involving getting messy. Lots of fun, laughter and action has been had – luckily without too much mess!

Woodpeckers have amazed the Yvonne Arnaud theatre team with how well they have all participated and their developing confidence in performing actions and scenes.











On Friday 10th November, a select group from the School Council had the opportunity to meet Angela Richardson MP. The children were excellent ambassadors for our school and showed all of our Gosden values as they asked her questions and told her about our special school.

The students explained why they liked Gosden.

Angela was very excited to hear about our learning and how we look after the animals. We asked her questions about her job and about her office to see if she would like some art work there. James wanted to invite her to our special school events and she said she would love to receive an invite. Skye asked about work experience and opportunities to visit The Houses of Parliament. After our discussion we had a very important job to show Angela around our school and see our wonderful learning in our classrooms.

In 'Our World' lessons we have been learning about the Celts. To learn more, we visited Butser Ancient Farm where we were able to experience Celtic Life. When arrived we were shown into an Iron Age Roundhouse with an open fire. It felt very strange and we needed to use our 'Being Brave' Learning Muscles a lot - soon we started to feel at home!

We learnt many new skills including jewellery making, spinning sheep's wool into thread and pottery making. It was great to find out how the Celts were able to do so many things with basic resources, and it was wonderful to take our goods home. We also visited a recreation of a Roman Villa, where we learnt a Roman board game. After a quick visit to the animals, it was time to head back home.

Well done Year 8 for being so brave and for learning so many new skills!















In Science lessons we have learnt about how different substances behave when we mix them with water and, when we heat and cool them. We set ourselves the challenge of trying to separate flour and rice and sugar from a sugar-water solution. We had to use our "Getting Ready" Learning Muscle to plan different experiments and our "Learning Together" muscles to complete everything in a safe way. Good work Year 8!







