
Huge thank you's to the Site team for all their Christmas decorating. The stage looked beautiful at the Primary Christmas Production




In Maths we have been comparing and ordering numbers. We have been using the signs < , > and = and had a go at applying our knowledge to some more challenging questions. This term we also explored position and direction. We loved dancing to the cha-cha slide, which helped us become more confident with positional language and our left and right. We worked in groups and took it in turns to be blindfolded. our partners had to give instructions to guide us through a maze. We kept trying and as we became more confident we had a go at doing some coding on the computer.

# What happens if you get Bullied?

If you don't know the difference between rude, mean and bully – here they are explained:

## **RUDE**

 Saying or doing something is not polite and not apologising.

It might be a one off thing.

 People may not realise they are being rude.

## **MEAN**


- Knowingly saying or doing unkind things, like not letting them join in games
- Deliberately hurting their feelings or doing something they asked you not to do.

### **BULLY**


 Intentionally doing something unkind multiple times, often to someone weaker than them.

This is what do you do if you get bullied:

- You can make friends with someone else
- Tell an adult
- You can walk away
- Be kind and keep calm
- You can be assertive



We could not find Cookie the Elf this morning during Maths! We looked everywhere and finally found her in the library with all our worksheets and a Christmas challenge! The class had to use their "Numeracy skills" to solve 4 clues and find the SECRET INVENTOR. These clues included; bar charts, measurements, number bonds to 20 and code cracking. The students used their "Learning Together" muscles by sharing their answers and helping to solve the mystery. The secret inventor was WINTER - what a cheeky elf!







As Year 9 have been working incredibly hard during their Our World lessons and learning lots of facts about yeast, Holly thought it would be a great idea to bake some bread. We used our "Getting Ready" Learning Muscles and our numeracy skills to collect the equipment and measure the ingredients. We then used our "Learning Together" muscles by working in a team to mix and make the dough. Holly taught the learners how to knead the dough to activate the yeast, creating bubbles to make the bread rise in the oven. The bread looked and smelt YUMMY! Yav for good microbes!

In PSHE this term we have been working on life skills. We first thought about personal hygiene, with the help of 'Stinky Bob' who was very dirty, and learnt how to keep ourselves clean and how often we needed to wash. Then we used our 'Being Brave' muscles and 'life skills' to practice making a hot drink and a piece of toast. We ordered the steps we would need to take, were careful with the hot kettle and toaster and even did the washing up once we had tested our drinks and toast!












A school's PTA means so much more. Personally for me it is a real sense of community bringing everyone at Gosden together, whether this be through a small fundraiser or one of the larger scale events.


