Rabbits have been using their 'Creative' Learning Habit to re enact the story in our role-play corner and have thoroughly enjoyed creating our very own story map to help us remember the correct sequence! Rabbits have enjoyed being creative in their investigation of materials; designing and testing the strength of their very own straw/stick/brick houses!















Rabbits have demonstrated fantastic use of their 'Learning Together' Habit to participate in learning outdoors! They particularly enjoyed a treasure hunt to find straw, sticks, and bricks and used their wonderful 'Noticing' Learning Habit to follow a set of instructions to successfully find and rescue the 3 little pig before the big bad wolf arrived!



In our Happy and Healthy lessons, Rabbits have been learning about 'Health, Lifestyle and Wellbeing.' So far, Rabbits have enjoyed using their 'Learning Together' Habit to explore how we can keep healthy. Rabbits particularly enjoyed 'Exploring' the germ experiment, practicing their teeth brushing skills, and participating in whole-class yoga! We will continue our learning by focusing on 'Feelings' and strategies that we can use to help us.





In our Maths learning, we have been using our 'Keep indig 'Habit to engage in simple addition and have been working hard to consolidate our skills to count out correct quantities! Rabbits have enjoyed various Three Little Pig-themed Numeracy activities and have enjoyed playing dice games in small-groups.

S Q U I R R E L s

Squirrels have been doing lots of great learning this half term!

In Maths we have been learning about addition. We used our **Creative** Learning Habit to create our own addition number stories. We have also been doing lots of **Problem Solving**, and Challenging ourselves by explaining how we got the answer. Next week we will start learning about time.

Our topic this term is the human body. So far we have learned about skeletons, muscles and the heart. We have been very excited and asked lots of questions and eagerly shared facts we already know.



In Literacy, we read the book "There's a snake in my school" by David Walliams. In the story the children have a "bring your pet to school day". We made predictions about what would happen next in the story and did some fantastic **Explaining** about the plot when doing our book review. We have been **Creative** in thinking about what our ideal pet would be, and what things it might get up to if we had a "bring you pet to school day".

Did you know that the human body has 206 bones?







We have enjoyed getting outside for some outdoor learning. One of our highlights was **Working Together** to build a giant spider web. We then had a challenge to find a path through without getting stuck in the it. Squirrels did brilliantly, they were very encouraging and problem solved as team to get everyone through the web! Year 9 enjoyed the start of our new Topic using all of their problem solving skills. They used their Learning Muscles to explore and auestion the clues that had been placed around the classroom. The learners used their **Being Brave** muscles by picking up objects and trying on costumes. They then used their Learning Together muscles by asking each other questions about each clue. The clues included; a banquet, a chamber pot, some old-fashioned clothes, maps, roses and a beheaded queen! Someone suggested our topic might be about a "King that killed his wives" which sparked another idea "King Henry". Before the teachers could introduce our new topic, we realised it was the "Tudors". We went on to find out who the Tudors were and focused on Henry VIII and his wives. Divorced, beheaded, died. Divorced, beheaded. survived!









Year 9 have been entered into a competition called Art Bytes. Art Bytes is a national art programme which combines an art competition with a virtual gallery. The programme nurtures talent, raises ambition and helps develop confidence, as well as supporting mental health and developing vital skills for future employment.

The students have chosen their favourite animal to draw and create a background for. They have used their ICT skills to find step by step guides to support their drawing. We look forward to telling you all about the next steps of the competition.







The Gosden Bakehouse has re-opened this term, just in time to lift everyone's spirits and warm us up during the cold month of January! We have an amazing team of hardworking young bakers this year who are making our coffee shop bigger and better than ever.

This term 7 students are providing a hot drink and snack service to the adults of Gosden. Every week we decide on a baked item to make, and half the team bake these in the morning whilst the other half of the team take orders from adults around the school. This gives us a great opportunity to practise our communication skills, ensuring we use loud voices and ask questions to make sure we get the right orders. We are also developing our money handling skills as we make sure we collect the right amount of money and give change if needed – there is lots to think about.





After we have collected all of the orders, we deliver our freshly baked goods and hot drinks to our happy customers. We are learning how to be safe and hygienic whilst making hot drinks, as well as having to be really organised to make sure no one gets the wrong order!

We think its really important to cater to different dietary needs that people may have and so far this term we have served sausage rolls (with a veggie option) and gluten free blueberry and white chocolate muffins.

We are really enjoying growing in confidence in the kitchen, developing a range of skills...although our favourite part is definitely the taste testing!

These training sessions support staff in recognising early signs of abuse and managing disclosures in the best possible way. The Flying Child Project encouraged us to reflect on our existing safeguarding practise and policies, whilst developing our confidence in using skills and judgement to best safeguard our children.

The Flying Child is a survivor-led, non-profit organisation, founded by Sophie Olson – a survivor of intrafamilial CSA. Their core aim is to normalise speaking about child sexual abuse, in society, in professional settings and within the survivor community itself.
