




The School Council ran a very successful Easter Egg Raffle. £170 was raised and this money will go towards Pets as Therapy. Thank you to everyone who bought tickets.







We have had a lovely term full of learning in Squirrel class. In Science we have continued our topic the human body. We had lots of fun learning about the digestive system, the names of the different organs involved and what they do. We did a great experiment using some bananas and crackers and digested them using a potato masher (for teeth) a plastic bag and orange juice (for the stomach and stomach acid) and some tights (for the intestines). Squirrels did brilliantly – ask us to explain the digestive system to you!





We also really enjoyed our reading and careers focus week. We met a fire fighter and asked some great questions and learned how they make pizzas at Pizza Express. We also loved doing a fairy tale scavenger hunt and guessing what books the characters were from.

In Literacy, we have been reading the story 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon to inspire our lessons. We used our 'Creative' Learning Habit when we imagined what Beegu's planet might look like by creating some beautiful paintings. We then used lots of 'WOW' words to describe it. We felt sad for Beegu so we used salt dough to make a friend for Beegu. We made comparisons between Beegu and her friend, finding similarities









and differences between them.



In Science, we have been learning about rocks. We discovered there are 3 types of rocks and enjoyed using our 'Exploring' Learning Habit when we carried out experiments to discover their different properties. At the end of this topic, we created some beautiful sand art by layering coloured sand.





We enjoyed a fun gardening session with Rob and Gill. We learnt about planting seeds and propagating rosemary and lavender. We found out what we need to do to look after our plants and are looking forward to watching them grow.













As part of Focus Week, Year 7 went to Sayer's Croft for an activity day. We worked together to solve problems using our **Learning Together** learning muscle, working as a team. Later on, we had the opportunity to pond dip and explore the nature around us. Some of us even found fish! After a very tasty lunch, we visited the roundhouse (which was very dark!) and sat around a camp fire making s'mores. They were delicious. We had an amazing adventure at Sayers Croft.

There has been lots going on in the last few weeks in Key Stage 4.

We are continuing to work towards our ASDAN PSHE qualification, and as part of this we have to complete travel training. We took a trip on the train to Redhill just before Christmas and this term we took the train to Guildford. Everyone felt a lot more confident this time around – we all remembered to stand behind the yellow line and even pointed this out to the adults! On the return journey we travelled by bus, so now have done travel training

on buses and train!

We have also been very creative this week, by starting a special project for Sandra called an aspirations tree. We created a wooden cut out of a tree and wrote down all the things we would like for our future on the leaves. Lots of great teamwork and 'Getting Ready' Learning Muscles.

We are continuing to work hard in our vocation subjects. This week the DT group have completed their projects ready to hand in – we have some signs for the garden, animals and Bakehouse, cushions and a beautiful wall hanging. Well done to Harry E, Zac, Charity and Sofia for their hard work.







Also as part of PSHE we have been working with groups called Generation Girls and Guys. In these sessions we have been learning about a variety of topics including healthy friendships and relationships, puberty and good mental health. Last week we completed our programme, received certificates and celebrated all the brilliant learning we had done.

Within Careers education, there are eight Gatsby Benchmarks that act as a framework for world-class careers provision and have been adopted as part of the Government's Careers Strategy within schools and colleges I have discovered a brilliant website that is interactive and it covers Labour Market Information (LMI) which is Gatsby Benchmark 2. It is aimed at SEND so really accessible for our learners.

Tax credits are ending, and moving to Universal Credit. Anyone receiving tax credits will receive a 'Migration Notice' when it is time to make the move. Look out for a letter called a Universal Credit Migration Notice from the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) explaining what you'll need to do, and by when. You won't be moved automatically, so it's important to follow the instructions in the letter, otherwise your benefits will stop.

<u>Understanding Universal Credit</u> should answer any questions and support your understanding of the move.

### A Parent's Guide to Cyberbullying











Many young people who are victims of cyberbullying suffer in silence.

They feel they can't turn to parents or a trusted adult for support as they fear they may get in trouble or have their devices taken away from them. It can carry on all day, all evening and all weekend for the world to see, causing a lot of emotional stress to the victim and their family.



It can very quickly lead to the victim feeling trapped, scared and vulnerable to grooming and blockmail.



Online safety is when young people know who they can tell if they feel upset by something that has happened online.




