Scary News

Some of our children become very worried about news stories. News is everywhere, and nowadays, it's almost impossible to control the news our children are exposed to, or shielded from. Young people have access to a huge amount of news information and will probably already be well aware of certain news events. It is important to help children process these events, but in a way that doesn't overwhelm them.

You can help to minimise the negative impact of news storied through open and honest conversations at home, using the tips below:

- •Find **balance in exposure**. Force-feeding children news OR going to great lengths to shield them from it can be unhelpful.
- •Share the facts. If a child feels overwhelmed by what they've heard or seen, provide clear and honest explanations of what is happening. It is ok to talk about scary subjects and it is ok to not have all the answers too. You can try reading or watching child-friendly news sources together.
- •Let your children know **they are safe**. The best way to communicate safety is by talking about worrying news with open, confident, clear and truthful facts. Go through all the reasons that mean they are in a safe place rather than well-meaningly dismissing their feelings by telling them everything is fine. Reassure them that you will look after them and do your best to keep them safe.
- •Find the **right time to talk**, and leave space for questions. Children tend to repeat themselves when they are feeling uncertain or worried. They may need to ask the same question a number of times until they feel more reassured.
- •Remind children that there is much more **good news** than bad news happening. And that there are many more good people than bad people in the world. The Happy Newspaper is a brilliant online newspaper for children and young people celebrating too the good world news!














Guildford Santa Fun Run Sunday 8th December 2024!
