It is unbelievable to think that the Robins are just starting their second half-term at school. They have been settling into the school routine, making relationships with their peers and class team, and also learning their way around our maze of a building. Even though it's been such a small amount of time, they have each shown such wonderful progress, both academic and personal. We are so proud of Robin Class, and all of their amazing learning that they have already thrown themselves into!







This half-term, our topic is 'The Gingerbread Man'. We have **listened** to the story, and used our Colourful Semantics cues to unpick the characters, and the changes to the setting throughout the book. We are very excited to begin learning to sequence and retell the story and to have a go at performing it in front of the green screen! In our Maths learning, we have been exploring a range of shapes. We have been experimenting to discover which 3D shapes stack and which ones roll, and finding a range of ways that we can use our shapes, such as building a gingerbread house and a bridge to cross a river.

We cannot wait to see all of the amazing learning that takes place over the coming weeks.




We have been busy learning all about our new class, team and classroom routines. Lots of bucket charts have already been completed as the class have looked for opportunities to be kind and helpful to each other as well as to the adults.

This past week we have been listening carefully to why the poppy is an important symbol to so many people. We learnt a bit about why people wear a poppy and painted some beautiful poppy pictures. We were also able to take part in the whole school assembly and sang a song called "We remember" with Kestrels class that included harmonizing and was beautiful to listen to.









In Numeracy we have mainly focused on place value, ordering numbers and the mathematical terms of "more than", "less than" and "equal to" along with the corresponding symbols. We have been challenged to solve various number problems that incorporate this learning and have explored different resources to use in our Maths lessons including Numicon, tens frames, number squares and even Cheerios!



Year 7 have been incredibly busy these past few weeks, both in and out of school!

We have been continuing our PSHE learning on Communities; looking at different types of communities and how we can make a positive impact within them. We created positivity pebbles to share with other classes within the school as well as writing messages of kindness to share with our friends.

We were very excited for our first ever Year 7 school trip to a Guildford Care Home. We had generated questions to ask the residents such as; What is your favourite colour? What was school like when you were younger? What is your favourite dinosaur? As well as Wilson's personal favourite; Do you like chicken nuggets? We spent time with the residents, chatting to them and playing games and creating some art pieces









Year 7's Our World Project of Movement and Migration has continued to be a popular lesson. We have started to look at Human Migration, thinking about why people migrate and how that enriches communities. We focused on the village of Cranleigh, and how it has changed throughout history due to human migration. We explored the high street to find evidence of human migration such as restaurants from different cultures and different types of food in Sainsbury's.

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Visit to Snoxhall Park



Add Everyone' Group Chats Safeguarding Alert



Recent concerns have emerged regarding a WhatsApp group known as 'Add Everyone.' Schools and regional police forces across the UK have warned that this group exposes children and young people to explicit and harmful material.

'Add everyone' group chats (also known by other names) are spaces where children and young people are invited, and encouraged to invite others into a group chat. These chats may contain inappropriate content, sexual images, self-harm, sexual violence or racism. Some chats also encourage the sharing of personal details. It can be difficult to control who becomes a member in such chats meaning that children and young people can become vulnerable.

These chats can seem appealing for many children and young people who seek social connection and are not aware of the potential dangers. Chat creaters, often strangers, exploit curiosity and share harmful content.
