They have delved right into their learning; using their 'Creative' and 'Learning Together' Habits to engage in rocket construction using our giant polydron and junk modelling materials. Owls particularly enjoyed watching clips of real-life rockets 'blasting' off into space and were fascinated by the domed ceiling and constellations on our trip at Woking Planetarium! Since reading our Non-Fiction focus text, 'Meet the Planets', Owl Class have become experts at naming the planets of our solar system and have demonstrated fantastic role-play as 'astronauts' too.






In our recent Literacy learning, Owls helped to create a story map for our story, 'Whatever Next' and re-enacted baby bear on his journey to the moon in his cardboard box rocket! Owl Class even used their '**Noticing**' and 'Listening' Habits to help pack a suitcase to the moon, practicing their blending of sounds to read/write CVC words too!







In our Maths learning, we have been **'Exploring'** the concept of capacity. Owl Class had so much fun **'Learning Together'** to explore 'full', and 'empty' using 'rocket fuel' and 'moon dust'. They used their **'Challenge'** Habit to investigate how to fill containers 'halffull' too!





The Rabbits have kicked off the Summer term with a bang. Firstly, our recent trip to the planetarium in Woking was an absolute triumph. The children were captivated by the wonders of the space and the solar system. It was truly magical to see their eyes light up as they learnt more about the stars and planets. This trip sparked much excitement and curiosity, encouraging the children to explore further into the mysteries of the universe.



In literacy, we have embraced a creative project that involves writing postcards from space inspired by our topic work on the solar system. The children have shown tremendous imagination as they share stories inspired by the lonely alien, Beegu. This exercise has not only improved their writing abilities but also encouraged them to think creatively and empathetically.

Back in the classroom, we have been delving into themes of personal importance and significance. The children have been contemplating who and what holds importance in their lives. This connects beautifully with our exploration of religious concepts, such as what heaven means to Christians. Through discussions and activities, the children have gained a deeper understanding of various beliefs and values. This learning will be followed by a trip to the local church next week.



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Our allotment has also been a hub of activity this term. The children have been busy harvesting the crops they planted earlier and are now enthusiastically involved in planting sunflower seeds. This hands-on experience teaches them about the life cycle of plants and the importance of nurturing our environment.







As we look forward to a bustling sports season, the children were able to show us their skills on our fantastic Sports Day. In addition, our swimming lessons have successfully recommenced, and everyone is having a fun time in the pool and most importantly gaining confidence and strength in the water.

We have looked into space exploration; what you might find if you were to travel to space; tracked an international space station and also delved into the life of the British astronaut Tim Peake. It has been a truly enriching halfterm filled with learning, exploration, and growth in the Rabbit Class.







Whilst Year 6 went away on their residential, the remaining Kestrels and Falcons had some fun days of activities. We were a mixed class, so we spent some time getting to know each other and building friendships. We used our **'Creative'** learning habit as we designed and made gingerbread boys and girls for our friends. 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












to the Sea Life Centre. We started our day's adventure with a workshop, using our 'Asking Questions' learning habit to discover many facts and information about sea creatures.

After using our 'Noticing' and 'Exploring' learning habits all morning, we were ready for lunch. We went through a special tunnel under the road and arrived on the beach.


We enjoyed eating our lunch, whilst enjoying the beautiful sunshine and watching the boats out on the water.




We then came back to school. The other Gosden students had gone home so it was very exciting having the school to ourselves!



Support Gosden House School when you play Your School Lottery - Your School Lottery In 8S we have been thinking about our Sense of Belonging toolkit in Citizenship, thinking about our environment. This was a great opportunity to get out in the beautiful weather and into the allotment.

Before we could plant our seeds, we carried out some research to find out more about the produce we are hoping to grow. We found out that some of the seeds would take a lot longer than others and we would have to be patient and regularly water the bed. As a team, we planted onions, carrots, beetroot and other vegetables. We will keep you updated on their progress!









In Life Skills we have been using our Being Brave and Getting Ready learning muscles. Set with a challenge of creating a healthy meal in 15 minutes with a budget of £1 a head, we have been busy thinking about healthy eating. Prior to any cooking, everyone has time to research and plan their creation.

We then create a shopping list for a food shop, making sure we are within budget, and send to the office ready for our online order. When we are in the kitchen we are using our Life Skills toolkit to create our dish and learning new skills, from using a tin opener to serving up the food. The best part is tasting our hard work!





As part of our topic Voyages of Discovery, we have used atlases to identify world oceans and think about life in the sea. We have explored coastal erosion and had a STEM challenge to create an effective barrier to minimise erosion.



After learning about current sea protection, we designed our own coastal defence and created a 'mini beach' in a tray. Some of us decided to use a mixture of vegetation and rocks, whilst others used sticks from the grounds to create a natural fence. To test our beaches, we created sea water using food colouring and created crashing waves. The vegetation and rocks seemed to have less erosion but we have left it outside to see if this changes.






The government's ambition for a new jobs and careers service will enable everyone to access good, meaningful work and support them to progress in work, including through a focus on skills and careers.
