


What a fantastic start we have had in Woodpecker class! On our first day we celebrated the fact that we are now top of primary and the privileges and responsibilities that that holds. We became superheroes for the day and thought of all the reasons why each of us are 'super'. We even made our own capes and decorated them with all the things that make us special and unique. We then worked as a class thinking of how we are going to make this coming year 'super' for Woodpecker Class.





As well as lots of team building activities, we have got stuck into our maths and literacy learning. In maths we have been using our 'Problem Solving' learning habit as we found different ways of representing the same number. We have also been playing games helping our understanding of substituting (see the amount but don't count'). We had fun using different types of dice to play 'Twister', 'Build a City' and 'Race to the Top'.



In literacy, we used our 'Creative' learning habit to make up our own stories. First, we chose some props to help us. 


