This half-term our topic is 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears', and we have used this as the basis for our learning. We have listened to and retold the story and used Colourful Semantics to find the 'who?' and the 'what doing?' on each page. We have discussed who is in our families, the foods we like (and don't like!), and adventured off into the woods.





In our maths learning, we have been developing our understanding of number. We have sung lots of songs to help with our rote counting, and worked on carefully counting by moving objects and saying one number at a time.

We are very excited to see what the Robins get up to next!




What a fantastic start we have had in Owl Class! The lovely little Owls have settled into their new classroom environment incredibly well and have been busy using their 'Exploring' and 'Learning Together' Habits to delve into the different provision areas inside and outside!







Our topic for this half-term, Goldilocks and The Three Bears, has facilitated plenty of opportunities for learning outdoors! Owls have particularly enjoyed their learning in Forest School every week where they have been re-enacting the story and using their 'Creative' Habit to make the bears from clay and to decorate using resources found around them! Owls were so excited to explore the house of the bears too -'Noticing' their chairs, beds, and even making Baby Bear's porridge "just right!".








In our Literacy lessons, Owls have been using their 'Keep Trying' Learning Habit to sequence the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. They have also used their 'Learning' Together' Habit to help create a story map as a class and have joined in to re-tell our story with actions and sound effects! Next week, we are looking forward to 'Exploring' mixtures by making porridge and cake too!








In recent PSED lessons, Owl Class have been 'Exploring' what makes them special and unique. Over in the Art area, Owls demonstrated fantastic use of their 'Creative' Learning Habit to paint their very own self-portraits using mirrors to help them!

We have been working really hard in Maths, counting, matching and comparing numbers as well as recognising numerals. We have used our 'Learning Together' Learning Habit when we have played maths games, and we have also used 'Keep Trying' too!





















Our topic is 'Fire, Fire' and we have used our Learning Habits of 'Exploring' and 'Creating' by working on our topic in Drama, Art, Science and PSHE. We found out about fire safety, including practising a fire drill and we have just started work on volcanoes, beginning with naming the parts!



We love to sing in Badger Class, so we are always singing songs to help us learn!










In Squirrels class we have started to learn about Egypt. They were shocked to find out what they ate but were happy to recreate stuffed shortbread biscuits – who knew the Ancient Egyptians had such a sweet tooth! Something they have in common with Squirrels class. We have also made our own jewelry following designs inspired by Ancient Egyptian fashions. The Squirrels class are also becoming experts in writing in hieroglyphics – amazing!



Despite this we all decided that we would rather live in the present day than Ancient Egypt as there are a lot less chores nowadays and back then girls were not even allowed to go to school!









In literacy we have been learning all about Fables and exploring the story of the lion and the mouse. This week we created our own characters that the lion and the mouse would help after they team up at the end of the story. They are working on creating newspaper and television reports to let everyone know what has happened to their characters.



As the seasons have started to change, we have been exploring the grounds, discussing the signs of Autumn and picking lots of delicious apples. This week we made apple tarts with apples from our school orchard. We have also started to help Miss Gale, our animal care teacher, to care for the animals, particularly feeding the goats and the chickens in the morning.






We are enjoying all our fabulous learning and your excellent imaginations Squirrels and cannot wait to see what we explore next!

Year 8 have made a fantastic start to their time in their new class and settled in well to their new routines.

We have taken on the responsibility for feeding the animals on Wednesday mornings and are all very good at remembering to feed them and knowing how to look after them.





We started the year by thinking about things that are important to us, what makes each of us special and our relationships with others. We looked at the art of 'Stik', an anonymous street artist and used him as inspiration to create art with sticks, representing our families. Can you spot anyone you recognise!!



In our last assembly we were introduced to Ellie, a representative of Atkins Realis. Atkins Realis is a project management company that provides engineering across a range of sectors, including infrastructure, nuclear, and clean energy. Ellie challenged our learners to solve an engineering problem. How can we make our environment more sustainable? They were allowed to improve infrastructure and environments that already existed or create their very own. The learners also used their ICT skills to create a document explaining their design and how it was eco-friendly and sustainable.

















It has been a very exciting start to the year for Key Stage 4 Catering and Hospitality students as we have been having our lessons in our newly refurbished Gosden Bakehouse. The kitchen space includes lots of new equipment and stainless steel benches just like we would find in a professional working kitchen which is really helping us to develop our work ready skills alongside our food preparation and food hygiene skills for our qualifications.





Last week we were really excited to host our first event in the cafe space. We really enjoyed decorating the space and took pride in showing it off to the rest of the school. We chose to host a Macmillan Coffee morning as a fundraising event and baked lemon drizzle cakes, Victoria sponges and our famous cheese twists from scratch. 
Best Next Steps Transitions Fair
