








In Maths, we have been finding out that numbers are made up of smaller numbers and have been working on the part, part, whole model and number sentences.





We have used our Learning Together Learning Habit to create firework paintings, find out about light in science, complete puzzles and to experience the snow!







Welcome to Gosden House School lottery. This lottery has been set up specifically to raise money and make a difference for our children!



We know that all of the skills we learn at school will help us with our future employment. In our class, everyone has a special job and so we created special badges to wear to show what
















We were very fortunate to have a visit from Kimba, a published poet. He shared some of his poems with us and guided us with how to create our own poems about our school. He was so inspirational.

Animals to calm you down


Like a great Gosden therapist,


We have also been getting out and about as well, and some of us got to do some travel training with the Try a Train




