

Afterwards, they made the rounds of feeding the guinea pigs, rabbits, goats and pigs. When feeding we check they have enough water and make sure they have clean homes. All of the year 7s really enjoy visiting the animals and do an excellent job of looking after them. We are hoping one of us will become an Animal Ambassador for the school.



Year 11 is getting very excited about their Work Experience which starts on 2nd February and runs for 2 weeks. Students will be experiencing what it is like to work in shops, cafes and with animals in animal rescue venues. This is such valuable experience to gain before moving on in their progression pathways in September 2026.



As part of their ASDAN Community Action project, Year 11 students also held a Christmas Chocolate Hamper raffle before Christmas and raised £70 for Shooting Star Chase, a local hospice for Children based in Artington.

They will be following this up with an Easter-Egg hamper raffle and the chosen charity is 'Healing Hearts and Minds with Horses', a charity that helps people with mental health using horses in a therapeutic way. Class-members each chose their preferred charity and created a presentation which they delivered to the class. Class-members then voted on which charity they preferred to support. Being Kind Online

Technology can be brilliant at helping our learners stay connected to their friends, but it can also cause problems. We have seen issues in group chats where messages have been unkind or misunderstood. Many young people find managing group chats difficult, and this is a challenge in all schools—not just ours. For our learners, who already find socialising and communication harder, this can be even more upsetting.

Online words can hurt just like spoken ones. Misunderstandings happen easily on screens.

Tips for Parents and Carers:

- Check in: Look at group chats and talk to your child about what's happening online.
- Remind them: Words matter—even online. Encourage kindness and respect.
- Talk regularly about online behaviour and kindness.
- Set clear rules for group chats and social media use.
- Encourage your child to take a break if they feel upset online.
- Remind them to tell an adult if something worries them.

Together, through the support and learning opportunities we also provide in school we can help our learners use technology in positive and caring ways.

The therapy team collaborate with school staff to embed communication strategies in lessons and social activities. We spend time in classes with students and staff, offer training, work with the leadership team, and problem solve to make sure all students have an effective way of communicating, and reasons to communicate.



Universal & Targeted Support

We help schools create an environment with high quality communication support, using a total communication approach.

We offer advice, resources, modelling and coaching for school-run intervention groups targeting language and social communication skills.



We offer further support at school's request e.g. classroom audits, training and advice for staff, attendance at parent's evenings and supporting staff to set communication targets.

Universal and targeted support ensures that your child's speech, language and communication support is embedded into the school's curriculum and throughout the learning day.

For many children and young people in MLD schools, this is the right level of support for their age and stage of development.

Whilst the SLT team may not be directly involved in working with your child at this level, they will support school staff in using a range of strategies e.g.

- Staff using developmentally appropriate language to deliver the curriculum
- Staff modelling appropriate language and communication throughout the school day e.g. simplifying language, high levels of repetition, breaking down instructions
- Using visual aids to support understanding, recall and use of language
- Staff providing specific opportunities for social interaction within the classroom environment, and supporting interactions throughout the day where necessary
- SLT working with the Senior Leadership Team in order to identify areas for staff training



Our team adopt a **neurodiversity affirming approach** within our support.

Specialist Support

When pupils need more support from our team, we offer individual, paired, or small group sessions, in and out of class. Support in class may involve modelling activities and approaches to school staff who can then use these within the classroom. We monitor and review progress of pupils receiving Specialist Support, and contribute to the Annual Review for all pupils receiving specialist input.



Dysphagia

If pupils have difficulties with eating, drinking and swallowing, we can refer them to the Dysphagia SLT team within our service for advice and/or assessment. The Dysphagia team can provide training and advice to school staff and their aim is to promote safe, efficient and enjoyable mealtimes. Some students will need assessment, and for key adults to receive advice and specific training on implementing recommendations to support them with their eating and drinking.



If you have any concerns about your child's speech, language, communication or feeding skills, please contact your child's class teacher/form tutor or the school SENCO in the first instance.
